



2019 WenLin Chongyang Festival Competition

Terms and Conditions

1. THE ORGANISER

- This competition is organised by WenLin Chinese School and WenLin Education Ltd. with registered offices at Kemp House, 152 City Road, London UK EC1V 2NX with company registered number 9375402U (The Organiser).
- By entering this competition, Entrants and their parents/legal guardian confirm that they have read and agree to be bound by these terms and conditions.
- The Organiser reserves the right to amend these terms and conditions or cancel this competition at any stage and accepts no liability to the Entrants as a consequence.

2. THE COMPETITION

- The title of the competition is #WenLinChongyangFestivalCompetition (the “Competition”)
- The theme of the competition is “Celebrating Chongyang Festival”. We would like Entrants to create a piece of artwork, write a story or poem reflecting their care, love and help for elderly in their family or in the community.
- The Organiser is offering those who enter this Competition a chance to win one of the following: A term of Mandarin Language Course worth £390, a £50 Amazon Gift Card, a £50 Waterstone Gift Card.

3. ELIGIBILITY

- Entrants must be UK residents, aged between 5 to 16 year old, at any point during the competition period of 9 September 2019 - 29 September 2019.
- The Entrant doesn't have to be enrolled student of WenLin Chinese School.
- This Competition is open to any employees, partners of the Organiser or any of their affiliate companies, their families, agents or anyone else connected with this Competition.
- The Organiser will ask all Entrants to provide proof of age, identity and eligibility. An appropriate adult (the child's parent or legal guardian) will be required to approve the Entry and agree to these Terms and Conditions on behalf of the Entrant.
- The Entrant's parent/legal guardian must provide their contact details as follows: name, email address, postal address and mobile contact number.
- If an Entrant fails to comply with a request for proof of identity or proof of parental consent, or provides false or misleading information, the Organiser may at their discretion, disqualify



the Entrant from the competition, or, where appropriate allocate the prize to another Entrant.

- The Entrant can enter one piece of work for each category set out for this competition throughout the Competition Period. Eg One Entrant can enter one piece of artwork, one piece of poem, and one story.
- It is recommended that the Entrant takes a copy of the piece of work submitted to the Competition.

4. HOW TO ENTER

- The Competition will run from 12:01am Monday 9 September 2019 (the “Opening Date”) to 11:59pm on Sunday 29 September 2019 (the “Closing Date”) inclusive; (the “Competition Period”).
- All Competition entries must be received by the Organiser by no later than 11:59pm on the Closing Date. All entries received after the Closing Date will not be valid.
- To enter this Competition, you need to submit a photo (“Photo”) of your child(ren)’s artwork, story, poem set out inline with the completion requirement to chongyang2019@wenlinchineseschool.org.uk
- The Entry can be entered individually or through participating schools.
- Your entry must include the Child full name, Date of Birth, and content in the email subject line eg: **WendyLiu_131209_Story**
- The Competition is free to enter however internet access and email access is required.
- The Organiser cannot guarantee continuous, uninterrupted or secure access to the competition website www.wenlinchineseschool.org.uk/competitions and is not responsible for any disruption to the competition or the website due to technical problems or otherwise due to events outside of its reasonable control.

5. ENTRY CRITERIA

The Entry needs to fulfil following criteria:

- Be the original work of the Entrant.
- Not contain defamatory, obscene, offensive or any other unsuitable material.
- Be suitable to be published and used online by The Organiser for audiences of all ages.
- Entrants and their parent/legal guardian must give assurances and agrees to indemnify the Organiser against any claim if this is not the case.
- Entrants can use a range of materials and techniques from the following list: drawing (e.g. pencil, pen, crayon, pastel, etc.), painting, printmaking, collage and montage (photography



can be integrated into the piece but we will not accept a standalone photographic entry), a written story or poem.

- Show a clear picture incorporating the child's entire work with no shadows visible.
- File format accepted: pdf, jpg.
- Entrants must complete all essential fields of the entry form. These include the name, email address, postal address and mobile contact number of a parent or legal guardian, and the name, age and region of the Entrant.
- Entrants and their parent/legal guardian agree that limited information such as name, age, region and town/city may be published in conjunction with Competition for publicity and ownership of the entry purpose.
- For school entries, by entering the competition, the teacher confirms and warrants that they have the permission of those pictured in the artwork (if any) (or, where the artwork pictures any persons under the age of 18, they have obtained the consent of that child's parent or guardian) for the photo to be published and used as contemplated by these Rules of Entry.
- The school is responsible for and must get obtain all necessary parental/guardian consents. They must provide any necessary notices required with the disclosure and use of personal information of the entrants as described here.
- Entries cannot be returned.

6. JUDGING

- The eligible entries shall be judged by four independent judges.
- All entries will be selected on originality, creativity, and how meaningful and special to the Entrant that he/she has thought about caring for the elderly in the family or in the community.
- The decision of Board of Judges is final and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into.
- The Finalists will be contacted. At this stage proof of Entrants' age, identity and eligibility will be requested.
- The Finalists will be contacted on Monday 30 September 2019 to arrange for the original work to be sent to the Organiser.
- The Finalists' parent/legal guardian must agree to post the Finalist's original work by recorded or guaranteed delivery to arrive with the Organiser by Thursday 3 October 2019. The original Entry must be posted in a hardback envelope and must not be folded or creased.
- The Organiser will not be liable for any original Entries lost or damaged in the post. Proof of sending is not proof of receipt.



- With express parental/legal guardian consent, Finalists maybe asked to partake in media interviews and photography requested by the Organiser for publicity purpose.

7. THE PRIZE

- There are three (3) prizes (herein referred to individually as “Prize” and collectively as “Prizes”) to be won and they are as follows:
 - (i) Top Prize: There will be one (1) top prize (the “Top Prize”) available to be won consisting of a £390 worth of Mandarin Language Course.
 - (ii) Second Prizes: There will be two (2) second prize available to be won consisting of a £50 Amazon Gift Voucher or £50 Waterstone Gift Voucher.
 - (iii) A winner’s certificate.
- All prizes are non-refundable, non-transferable and non-exchangeable and there is no cash alternative offered.

8. WINNERS

- The Winners will be notified on the 5th October 2019.
- Each winner will be asked to provide their full name and address. If a winner fails to respond within five (5) working days of the notification, a re-selection will take place from the remaining valid entries to select a new winner. If any winner declines a prize or fails to respond within the required period, they forfeit any right to the prize.

9. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- The Entrants retain the copyright in their Entries but grant to the Organiser a Worldwide perpetual, non-exclusive, royalty-free license to publish (across all media) and post the entry online and on any other platforms not yet envisaged.
- Winning entrants shall not object to any cropping or other minor alteration of the photographs of their artwork when used outside the remit of this competition.

10. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- In so far as permitted by law, the Organiser will not in any circumstance be liable to compensate the winner or accept any liability for any loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring as a result of taking up the Prizes except where it is caused by the negligence of the Organiser or that of their employees. Your statutory rights are not affected.

11. DATA PROTECTION AND PUBLICITY

- The Organiser shall ensure that all personal data is complied with under the Data Protection Act 1988 and the General Data Protection Regulation 2018.



- Any personal information communicated to the Organiser by Entrants and their parents/ legal guardians will be used solely for the purposes of administering the competition. The Organiser will not share any personal information with third parties unless required by law.
- Entrants and their parents/legal guardians have the right to (i) access their personal data, (ii) require that it be corrected, updated, or deleted and (iii) ask the Organiser to send them a copy of their personal data in a format commonly used and machine readable. The Organiser will consider these requests in accordance with applicable law and may also verify the identity of the Entrants and their parent/legal guardian for the purpose of processing these requests.
